Section 2 : Health Hazard Data

Acute Health Effects: To the best of our knowledge, the toxicological properties of this compound have not been fully investigated. May be harmful if ingested, inhaled or absorbed through the skin. May cause sensitization or allergic reaction in sensitive individuals. Exercise appropriate precautions to prevent opportunities for inhalation, and to prevent direct contact with skin and eyes. Symptoms of overexposure may include: burning sensation, coughing, wheezing, laryngitis, shortness of breath, headache, nausea, vomiting, skin rashes, pimples, boils, hives, black and blue spots or runny nose. Iodides are readily diffused across the placenta, and Neonatal deaths from respiratory distress secondary to goiter have been reported. This compound has also been shown to have teratogenic effects in laboratory test animals. Women who are or who may be pregnant should exercise caution. All uncharacterized chemicals should be treated as suspected toxins.

Section 3 : First Aid Measures

Eye Contact: Check for and remove contact lenses. Flush eyes with running water for at least 15 minutes separating eyelids. **Seek medical attention immediately.**

Skin Contact: Wash with soap and water for 15 minutes. Remove contaminated clothing and shoes. **Seek medical attention immediately.**
